Analysis of Factor Causing Incomplete Filling of Inpatient Informed Consent Forms at the Andongsari Health Center, Jember Regency

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ABSTRACT

Informed consent is approval given by the patient or the patient's family after receiving a complete explanation regarding the medical procedures carried out fon the patient. This type of research is qualitative to determine the completeness of filling out the informed consent form and collecting data using interviews, observation and documentation. At the Andongsari Jember Community Health Center, the percentage of completeness in the patient identification section of the informed consent form was 92%. Important reporting was 93.83%, while the percentage in the authentication section was 81.66% and correct documentation was 78.92%. The results of this research are that there are problems with the Man variable, the educational background of the RM head does not meet the standard qualifications as a medical recorder, there is no training carried out at the Community Health Center and a lack of discipline among the officers at the Andongsari Jember Health Center, and the Method variable, namely the absence of an SOP regarding filling out informed consent. Based on the results of this research, Found a problem in the variable man and method, money material machine no problem was found it is hoped that officers will continue their education until it is equivalent to the duties they receive. The community health center will provide training to officers regarding informed consent, provide rewards to officers who are disciplined and punish officers who are less disciplined, and create SOPs regarding filling out informed consent.
